Coronavirus cases in LLR

As at 24th April there were 1367 cases in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland (LLR) and 183 people at sadly died in Leicester's hospitals (includes Leicestershire Partnership Trust)

Register for voluntary sector support

Vulnerable people and their families will be able to directly call on the army of NHS Volunteer Responders, the NHS and Royal Voluntary Service have announced today. Over 600,000 volunteers have been approved to help those most at risk who are isolating at home from coronavirus, more than double the original target.

The scheme has been fully operational for two weeks with healthcare practitioners, pharmacists and local authority and social care staff calling on volunteers to carry out around 35,000 tasks to date, including delivering medicines, shopping and other supplies as well as making calls to check in on those isolating at home.

To protect the scheme for those who need it, only those who are clinically at risk or who meet the criteria should refer themselves for support. Referrals can be made by calling 0808 1963646.

Blood pressure? Keep taking the meds

People who take lifesaving blood pressure medication are being urged to continue doing so amid misleading rumours that the medicine could worsen coronavirus infection. Speculation online and on social media has suggested that some high blood pressure medication might make coronavirus symptoms more severe, despite there being no clinical evidence to support the claims.

Health professionals, GPs and other medical providers across Leicester are calling on people who do take prescription medicine for high blood pressure – also known as hypertension – to continue to do so, as stopping may lead to other health problems. Read more here

Care workers action plan

The Government has published a new national action plan to support the adult social care sector in England throughout the coronavirus outbreak. The Plan includes better access to testing and provision of additional Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) items, a campaign to expand the care workforce and the launch of a new unifying identity for the care sector. On testing the aim is that all care workers who need a test will receive one, and all symptomatic care home residents will be tested to prevent outbreaks. Companies urged to donate PPE

The Lord Lieutenant is teaming up with local councils and business leaders in a new drive urging companies to donate personal protective equipment (PPE) for key workers. The appeal – spearheaded by Mike Kapur – asks firms to donate any new and unused items such as fluid-resistant surgical masks, nitrile gloves, goggles, disposable aprons or overalls, sanitising gel and overshoes, and to consider using their factories or equipment to produce more of these specific PPE items.

Chiefs from Leicestershire County Council and the Leicester and Leicestershire Enterprise Partnership are backing the call to bolster the equipment for staff in the NHS, social care, children's homes, homeless shelters, community pharmacies and more. Mike Kapur OBE, Lord-Lieutenant of Leicestershire, said: "Donations have been brilliant. Now we need to ask to our bigger companies and partners across our area to step in. Could you help? We are looking for PPE equipment in bulk, if possible. Our communities have been so generous. Now we need a response at scale to help keep our frontline workers safe. Businesses can't return to anything like normal until the NHS can get on top of the virus so it's very much in businesses' interest to get on board and help. Read more.
